Dayspring double murder added to rewards program

Jack and Micheline Hulme killed in 1985

COUNTY — The 1985 double murder of a Dayspring couple has been added to the province's Rewards for Major Unsolved Crimes Program.

The Department of Justice made the announcement April 16, indicating information in the deaths of Jack and Micheline Hulme could now be worth up to \$150,000.

"We are adding this case today with the hope that someone, somewhere, will make a decision to come forward with information that will lead us to make an arrest. The family deserves to have closure," Sgt. Bill Raaymakers of the RCMP Southwest Nova Major Crime Unit said in a media release.

The bodies of Mr. and Mrs. Hulme were discovered on June 3, 1985, in the rubble of their burned home.

Firefighters had responded at 1:30 a.m. to find the two-storey structure fully engulfed in flames. The intense heat kept them out until morning.

They first found the body of Mrs. Hulme, who investigators determined had been in bed with she died. Her husband's body was located in the kitchen area, where the fire was believed to have started.

The fire marshal's office was called in to assist with the investigation, which authorities believed was a fatal fire.

Grief over the Hulmes' deaths turned to shock in the community and beyond when autopsies revealed the couple had been shot to death before the blaze.

The fire had been intentionally set in an effort to conceal the crimes. An accelerant was used to make the house burn faster.

The Hulmes have long been described as good people, a loving couple raising their two sons. They had volunteered as boy scout leaders and lived a quiet lifestyle.

Mrs. Hulme, who was 41, walked each morning with a couple of neighbours. She enjoyed gardening, cooking and antiques, and had a flare for both decorating her home and being a stylish dresser.

Mr. Hulme, 46, whose first name was John although he went by Jack, was a local gunsmith and amateur inventor, a design engineer who was also president of his own small manufacturing company.

Empire House changing roles

Province replacing youth shelter with new service

BRIDGEWATER — A provincially-run shelter program in Bridgewater ends in a couple of months, but will be replaced with what the Department of Community Services is calling a new family-focused, child-centred range of services for vulnerable youth and their families.

The new program "will link youth and their families with health providers, school, housing, employment and other social and community supports," the Community Services department

said in a statement released last week. "The new service model will begin in July to allow four youth at the shelter to complete the school year."

Community Services is partnering with Family Service of Western Nova Scotia to link families to more health, education and residential supports, the province said. The new service is expected to be begin phasing in operations in July. Details and decisions surrounding how the new service will best meet the needs of South Shore youth and families are still being finalized, the department said.

Government does not traditionally operate shelters, an e-mail from Community Services spokeswoman Elizabeth MacDonald said, so a decision was made to work with community-based service providers who are in a much better position to deliver the assistance. The handful of Empire House staffers will be re-assigned.

The Empire House program, which opened in 2002 as a multi-bed facility designed to help in the battle against youth homelessness, ends June 30.

Lease agreement pending on Bluenose shed

LUNENBURG — Westergard Boat has announced on its Facebook page that they have reached an agreement with the Waterfront Development Corporation Limited to lease the building known as the Bluenose shed which is located on Lunenburg's historic waterfront.

The shed is the building in which Smith and Rhuland built the original Bluenose II back in 1963, as well as other vessels such as the Bounty replica which was launched in 1960.

Westergard Boat says on the social media site that they are planning to revive the building to its original purpose by building a 60-foot gaff-rigged schooner for the Blue Dream Project.

According to its website, the Blue Dream Project was started by a group of concerned individuals who "want to look directly, squarely [and] unafraid at today's reality."

"We can easily assess the damage that our 'progress' has brought to our planet," the website explains. "Some of this damage is irreversible, no doubt, like the total extinction of numerous species, but some of it can still be mended."

To that end, the project members have decided to build a sailing boat, a 60-foot wooden schooner, in the tradition of the Nova Scotia old-time fishing schooners, "such that we may

go out to sea and explore personally the magnitude of the problem. When I say 'personally' I mean in person: 'each and every person' that wishes to will have the opportunity to come with us and witness firsthand the beauty of the ocean ... and the ugliness of plastic pollution and its consequences.

"We have chosen to build a wooden boat as an activity, in itself, symbolic of the immense need humanity faces to slow down, which, in our view, can constitute the starting point for an enhanced awareness of our own lives and of the interdependence of all things, animate and inanimate, on the planet."

The wood for the construction of the vessel comes from wind-fallen trees and certified sustainable forests in Canada and all the materials that will be used to equip the boat will be natural, eco-friendly and sustainable, limiting synthetic equipment to the absolute minimum, according to the website.

"The main source of energy for the entire construction project will be 'elbow oil,' an ancient substance today almost forgotten, deriving mostly from the transformation of vegetable, organic produce," the site says.

Gerry Rolfsen, president of the Lunenburg Waterfront Association Inc., says a deal to lease the Bluenose shed is in place, however, a few loose ends have to be tied up before it will be officially announced.

Ms MacDonald points out there will be a broader service available in addition to the operation of a shelter.

service provider, but no decisions have been made yet," she said.

The Family Service of Western Nova Scotia called the change a positive step forward in the province's capacity to meet the needs of all Nova Scotians.

The four youth who call Empire House home will be transitioned to the new service model, Ms MacDonald said.

"There won't be any gap for these people," she said.

THE COURT REPORT

■ **Impaired drivers fined.** Blowing breathalyser readings of 120 and 130 milligrams of alcohol in 100 millilitres of blood after being turned away from the liquor store because he was already intoxicated landed a Pleasant River man in court April 16. **Trent William Lewis**, 22, pleaded guilty to a charge of failing the breathalyser and was fined \$1,300. He was prohibited from driving for a year. Mr. Lewis was stopped in Bridgewater on March 21.

Failing the breathalyser after pulling up to a police checkpoint will cost a Blockhouse woman \$1,300 and her licence for a year. **Kimberly Anne Morash**, 42, pleaded guilty to a charge of failing the breathalyser April 16. She was stopped in Bridgewater on February 23 and later blew two readings of 140 milligrams of alcohol in 100 millilitres of blood.

■ **Assaulted wife.** A Wileville man who assaulted his wife is now on probation. It's part of a conditional discharge that **Timothy Edward Joudrey**, 48, received April 16 after admitting the January 28 assault. He grabbed his wife by the hair and threw her to the floor during an argument. Their children separated them after hearing the commotion from upstairs. While on probation, Mr. Joudrey, who had no prior convictions, must take counselling as directed.

■ **Breached curfew.** Resisting police who caught her out past her curfew landed a Bridgewater woman on probation April 16. **Sonja Ann Allen**, 21, pleaded guilty to charges of resisting arrest and breaching an undertaking from January 3 when police saw her walking on a Bridgewater street 90 minutes after she was supposed to be at home. Ms Allen was fined \$130. The judge also placed her on probation for nine months ordering her to take counselling as directed.

■ **Drank against rules.** A Bridgewater man who got drunk and went to the wrong address while on a court order not to drink pleaded guilty to a charge of breaching release conditions April 16. **Justin Scott Croft**, 23, will spend nine months on probation getting counselling in connection with the crime. It happened on January 7 when he banged on the door of his former address at 1:30 a.m. believing he still lived there.



Bridgewater tables draft budget

Town proposes holding the line on tax rates

BRIDGEWATER — The residential and commercial tax rates in Bridgewater are expected to hold steady this year, while the sewer rate is expected to increase, according to the town's 2014-15 draft budget.

The details were presented at a council meeting on April 14. This year's proposed operating budget totals \$18.5 million and the capital budget \$3.3 million.

The residential tax rate will stay at \$1.65 per \$100 of assessment, while the commercial tax rate of \$3.99 per \$100 will also stay the same. Both the residential and commercial tax rates have remained unchanged since the 2012-13 fiscal year.

The preliminary budget includes a sewer rate increase of 15 per cent and the special purpose tax remaining at eight cents per \$100 of assessment.

Deputy Mayor Bill McInnis is suggesting that council cut the special purpose tax in half to four cents per \$100 of assessment.

"In my view, there's room to reduce that," he said.

The special purpose tax is dedicated to repaying the \$5 million the town borrowed for the Lunenburg County Lifestyle Centre and was set to pay the debt over a 20-year period.

"The eight cents per \$100 assessment is raising more money than we anticipated," said Deputy Mayor McInnis, in an interview with the Progress Bulletin. The \$5 million that was originally borrowed is now down to \$3 million, he explained.

"We're collecting in excess of \$500,000 a year with that tax."

"It's a long-term facility, it's going to be here for a long, long time, so is it fair to have the residents of today pay for a facility that will be used 20 years down

the road?" he said.

The town is also taking on debt of \$2 million, a major part of it due to the LED street lighting project. The town will have to pay a higher fee than expected to own the LED lights.

"We're going to have an interesting conversation in May of whether to continue with the plan that we will purchase the lights and then contract out the maintenance of them, or that we're going to stay with Nova Scotia Power and continue to lease them," said Mayor David Walker.

Mayor Walker said there's potential for the draft budget to be changed significantly.

"I think there's a feeling among some councillors that we have [the] Dominion Street project that's not completed, we have Smith subdivision area that has significant issues that need to be addressed," he said.

The mayor explained more work may need to be done near the Smith Avenue subdivision regarding pipes and re-routing of water.

The Dominion Street project would include repaving the street, and replacing the curb and sidewalk.

"These are not in the budget right now. I believe that we need to make some move in bringing those in. So, it's at what cost because I don't think there's an appetite among any of the councillors to increase the tax rate," said Mayor Walker.

"It means finding either more effective and efficient ways to do some of the things we're doing now to free up some money, or to move some things from what's in the capital budget now to a future year, in bringing Dominion Street and the Smith subdivision perhaps into this year's budget — even if it's in a phased process."

Gail Benoit guilty of theft

Cleared of fraud and identity fraud charges in dog care case

BRIDGEWATER — Minutes after being found guilty of theft, well-known puppy broker Gail Benoit grumbled to reporters about court ethics and disputed claims of a New Brunswick woman who testified two white boxer dogs weren't given away but were in Ms Benoit's temporary care.

"The justice system is always corrupt. They're always burning me. They're always burning me," Ms Benoit said upon exiting a Bridgewater courtroom April 15 at the conclusion of a two-day trial.

"If the woman cared so much for her dogs and I was so-called boarding them, then she should have had something stating that I was taking care of them for awhile, or babysitting them, but she had none of that. The bitch gave the dogs away and then she started hollering theft."

Ms Benoit, before leaving the courthouse, gave a female reporter impromptu fashion advice and suggesting scribes assist in finding the location of a missing Malaysia Airlines Flight 370.

"Every dog has his day," she remarked before leaving the courthouse.

On April 15, the day the defence presented its case, Ms Benoit testified to responding to an on-line advertisement that indicated there were two dogs available to give away to a good home.

"It was never, ever mentioned that I had to board the dogs, look after the dogs. None of that was ever mentioned," Ms Benoit, who resides in Dartmouth, said on the stand. "She brought the dogs to give to me."

Cassie Craft, who owned the dogs originally, testified April 14 that she was busy with work and school and that she entrusted a woman, whom she later identified as Ms Benoit, to provide temporary care for boxer dogs Bentley and Diamond back in late 2012.

Judge Jim Burrill said, in a case where credibility was important, he didn't believe Ms Benoit's evidence, suggesting

the defendant tried to "explain away any circumstance by any means she could concoct."

He later commented: "And it is very clear from the whole of the testimony, in my view, given the time frames involved, that Ms Benoit obtained those dogs, not to have them as pets as she said, but had set about a course to obtain these dogs so she could sell them for profit."

The court heard that a month or so after Ms Craft dropped off the dogs responses to her emails stopped and the phone line of the home where she left the animals was disconnected.

Ms Craft uploaded an ad on Kijiji in early 2013 notifying the public that the animals had been stolen.

Jenny Woods of Bridgewater replied to the ad, explaining in testimony April 14 that she paid \$300 to buy boxer dogs named Bentley and Diamond in the area of the Bridgewater Mall

and had given Diamond to her sister and sold Bentley after finding that the dogs weren't behaving well.

After court on April 15, Crown attorney Lloyd Tancock suggested the judge's decision was "a very good finding for the credibility of the young lady who lost her dogs for a short period of time."

Ms Craft testified on the first day of the trial that it took at least \$1,500 in veterinarian bills to correct health issues with both dogs after she was reunited with them.

Ms Benoit will be sentenced on the theft charge on June 2. She was cleared of the single counts of fraud and identity fraud.

Ms Benoit's daughter, Ashley Bailey, and nephew Cole Benoit, were the other defence witnesses called to the stand on the second day of the trial.

The Crown witnesses of the first day were Ms Craft, her father Thomas Craft, friend Kaitlynn Barker, Ms Woods and Bridgewater police investigator Cst. Troy Vanderlinden.

Police watchdog investigating assault allegation

COUNTY — The province's independent police watchdog is investigating an alleged assault by a local Mountie.

According to a media release issued April 16 by the Serious Incident Response Team (SIRT), a male officer with the Bridgewater RCMP office was arrested on the night of April 15 after his wife complained that he had assaulted her.

She first contacted the local detach-


ment. The RCMP then contacted SIRT as required under the provisions of the Police Act.

The officer has not been identified, but has six years of service with the force.

He has been released on conditions.

No charges had been laid at the time, but the release indicated he is scheduled to appear in Bridgewater provincial court on May 7 if that happens.

SIRT is responsible for investigating all serious incidents involved police in the province.

He spent a lot of time in his small machine shop where he worked on various projects. Friends described him as clever.

The couple spent the day before they were killed, a Saturday, at home. They had just returned from a trip to their home province of Quebec. Mrs. Hulme mowed the lawn. Mr. Hulme chatted with a neighbour around 8:30 p.m.

Their oldest son, Paul, lived in Sydney. Steven was about to graduate from high school and planned to go to university. He spent Friday night at the home of his girlfriend's family and travelled with them to a horse show on Saturday.

Witnesses later told police that they heard what they thought were two or three gunshots in the area around 12:15 a.m.

Contacted last week following the announcement, Paul Hulme said he's pleased the case has been added to the rewards list. He'd been working to accomplish that for some time.

"We see the inclusion in the program as a positive thing," he said, adding he's hopeful someone will come forward with new information.

Anyone who shares information leading to the arrest and conviction of whoever is responsible for the Hulmes' deaths could receive up to \$150,000.

The Rewards for Major Unsolved Crimes Program was launched in 2006 as a tool to help police gather information. It has since helped the RCMP lay charges in connection with two previously unsolved homicides.

Mom went after alleged druggie with bat

COUNTY — A Bridgewater woman told a provincial court judge last week she was like a "mother bear taking care of her baby cub" when she went after an alleged druggie with a baseball bat to protect her daughter.

Judge Gregory Lenehan said he could understand Michelle Marie MacInnis' feelings on November 12, 2012.

"I can understand your motivation. I cannot condone your actions, but I do understand the motivation," he said April 16.

Ms MacInnis, 42, pleaded guilty to a charge of assault with a weapon.

Crown attorney Michelle MacDonald said police were called to a home in Upper Branch after Ms MacInnis broke a door window with a bat, then used the bat to hit a man who lived there in the stomach a couple of times.

Legal aid lawyer Cathy Benton told the court Ms MacInnis believed her daughter was at the home at the time. She also believed the man used drugs and provided her daughter with a place to use substances.

"She lost it," Ms Benton said. "The situation was extremely emotional for her."

As it turned out, she added, Ms MacInnis' daughter, now 20, was hiding in the home, but has since stopped using drugs.

Ms MacInnis had no prior record, but was herself addicted to Demerol in the past. Because of that, her lawyer said, she was even more concerned for her child.

The victim suffered no lasting injuries.

"I think there's a large segment of the community that would have a lot of sympathy for what you did. I don't think they would be offended at all if you were given a break," Judge Lenehan said.

He placed Ms MacInnis on probation for 15 months as part of a conditional discharge, ordering her to take anger management counselling as directed and to stay away from the man she assaulted.

She's not to possess firearms while on the order and must submit a DNA sample for the national criminal data bank.

Mahone Bay drops out of Regional Enterprise Network plans

MAHONE BAY — The county's smallest town has opted out of the newest entity designed to drive economic development in the region.

At a meeting April 8, elected officials in Mahone Bay decided they won't be participating in the Regional Enterprise Network (REN).

Councillor Kelly Wilson suggested he doesn't see the need.

"My stance is I'd be quite happy to have industry develop on the outskirts of Lunenburg or in Bridgewater or wherever, because we benefit in any case. We're all part of the same community, so why should we get stressed out about it," Councillor Wilson said.

Councillor John Bain agreed, saying Mahone Bay really doesn't have space to attract large industry and could see rewards "if Lunenburg got something big."

Mayor Joe Feeney said the town already benefits from Michelin, HB Studios and other businesses.

The REN model was announced in November 2012 as the province's response to the federal government's elimination of funding to regional development authorities (RDAs).

At the time, the panel recommending the creation of six RENs suggested they would "bring together business communities, the province, municipalities and other groups involved in economic development" and would "better coordinate and sharpen focus on helping businesses develop and grow."

To date, the REN for the region is still in the works.

Results from resident budget input survey released

People want investment in streets, development

BRIDGEWATER — Bridgewater residents would prioritize investing in streets and development over policing, recreation and culture, according to the results of the 2014-15 budget input survey.

The survey included four questions asking residents which services they would like to expand if it meant an increase in property taxes and which services they would reduce to keep property taxes low.

The results were presented to town council at a meeting on April 14.

"If we were asking residents where they'd like us to invest in a project, some of the themes I have found that have come up over and over again have been the streets and development in general, whether that be downtown development or generations active park," said strategic initiatives coordinator, Amy Wamboldt.

"In the area of asking where we might reduce spending, comments relating to policing and recreation and culture seemed to have been generalized themes," she said.

The survey was distributed electronically and in paper form, receiving 118 responses from residents compared to 300 last year.

It focused on areas including:

- protection to people and property (police service, fire services and by-law enforcement)
- transportation services (road maintenance, sidewalks, snow removal)
- recreation and culture (DesBrisay Museum, pool, programming, arena)
- parks and trails (development, maintenance, grass cutting, beautification with flowers and tree pruning)
- community and economy development (public communications, business growth, marketing and tourism).

Two of the questions were opened to comments and opinions. Residents were asked where they'd like money to go if the town were to invest in a specific service or project and where they'd like to see savings found if the town had to reduce spending on a specific service.

Ms Wamboldt explained that transportation services are an area where residents may be willing to pay more.

If they had to choose reducing a service to keep property taxes low, 77 per cent said they wouldn't want to reduce transportation services. Another 47 per

Strategic initiatives coordinator

for improved services and 53 per cent said no."

When it came to recreation and culture, "80 per cent said no, they wouldn't be interested in paying more taxes to increase that service; 20 per cent said they would," she said.

Forty-four per cent indicated they would reduce protection services to keep taxes low and another 67 per cent said they would not raise taxes to expand the service.

Mayor David Walker said it would be more beneficial to have the results earlier on in the budget process.

"We've tabled a draft budget, so factoring in some of the concerns that were raised by citizens or even the priorities that they seem to indicate, to a degree, it's difficult at this stage now to start shifting gears. I think it's important to get that information much earlier in the

process so it can start to affect the direction that council is moving in," he said in an interview with the Progress Bulletin.


Results from the survey are similar to last year.

"One of the debates or discussions that we're going to have to have is what kind of sample is a reasonable sample of your residents?" said Mayor Walker.


"There's a lot of information, a lot of understanding about town departments, what we do and how we do it, but it doesn't seem to be well appreciated by the residents and I think that means we have to do a better job of communicating what we do within a department and how we do it," he said.

Trying to take back guilty plea

Change in lawyer changes position on drug charge

COUNTY — A change in lawyers has meant a change in position for a Pinehurst man facing drug and criminal charges.

Gary Harold Bushen, 64, was on the provincial court docket in Bridgewater April 16 after pleading guilty to charges of possessing hydromorphone and breaching release conditions earlier this year.

But instead of a sentencing hearing going ahead, defence lawyer Michael Power appeared on Mr. Bushen's behalf telling Judge Gregory Lenehan his client wants to withdraw those pleas.

Mr. Bushen was represented by a Nova Scotia Legal Aid lawyer when he pleaded guilty back in January, so a hearing has been scheduled for June 17.

Judge Lenehan reminded Mr. Power

that his client will face the original allegation of possession for the purpose of trafficking, not the lesser included charge he pleaded to, if the case eventually goes to trial.

Mr. Bushen was charged after officers with the South Shore street squad arrested him on the evening of April 10, 2013, after stopping a vehicle on Highway 10.

Police said they seized a quantity of pills at the time.

He was already scheduled to go to trial on charges from a police drug sting in the summer of 2011.

Mr. Bushen was working as a taxi driver that August when he twice sold marijuana to an undercover police officer.

He received an 18-month conditional sentence, which included a year on house arrest, in May 2013 after being convicted of two counts of trafficking and one count of possessing hydromorphone.

He has eight other prior drug convictions dating back to 1981.

Those include priors for possession for the purpose of trafficking in 1991 and 2002.

Council considers future of Bridgewater Memorial Arena

BRIDGEWATER — Bridgewater Town Council is discussing possible options for the future of the Bridgewater Memorial Arena.

At a meeting on April 14, council decided it would approach the Municipality of Lunenburg and the Lunenburg County Lifestyle Centre to determine if financial arrangements can be made to acquire or partner in the operation of the facility.

The decision was made after two recommendations from the parks, recreation and culture advisory committee.

It was recommended that council keep the facility open for a 36-month study period.

“During this time, the ongoing usage of the facility will be assessed and, in the final eight months of 36-month assessment period, a review be conducted to determine if the Bridgewater Memorial Arena should be open for an extended period,” said director of parks, recreation & culture, Carol Pickings-Anthony.

The assessment would also determine whether or not focus should be aimed at constructing a second surface at the Lunenburg County Lifestyle Centre. If the study finds there is “insufficient use to justify two ice surfaces in Bridgewater, the arena would close,” explained Ms Pickings-Anthony.

The second recommendation to council was to work with the LCLC board and the Bridgewater Memorial Arena to have both facilities “work cooperatively to maximize the potential ice usage,” she said.

“Some of the users were astounded at the thought of closing the arena recognizing the current demand in the community. We must also consider the health and welfare of children and adults, and our reputation in the community,” she said.

Originally, there were two ice surfaces planned at the LCLC. The committee suggested that having a second surface would provide an opportunity for events such as craft shows, garden shows and sports shows.

If council accepts the recommendations, the committee report indicates that “the impact to the budget for 2014-15 would be \$154,597.”

“The only way I’d have any interest whatsoever in keeping that open is if we had a 50 per cent partner,” said Deputy Mayor Bill McInnis.

Councillor Michael Graves encouraged council to have a conversation with the municipality and the LCLC.

“I think this is a community asset, it’s a regional asset, and we should be having a conversation with MODL. I think that we should be asking them to contribute monies toward the arena, because we can’t afford to do it ourselves,” he said.

Three groups get seniors funding

COUNTY — A trio of local organizations have been named benefactors of grants through the federal government's New Horizons for Seniors program.

South Shore - St. Margaret's MP Gerald Keddy made the announcement on behalf of Minister of State for Seniors Alice Wong at Royal Canadian Legion Branch #24 in Bridgewater April 15.

Bridgewater's Legion branch will receive \$17,499 to assist in the installation of a new fire suppression system in their kitchen, as well as a stove and cooler so that the senior auxiliary group can re-establish their fundraising breakfasts, luncheons and banquets.

Those activities were curtailed when a fire inspection deemed the previous fire suppression system inadequate.

The Lunenburg County based Mi'kmaq Burial Ground Research and Restoration Association [MBGRRRA] will receive

\$21,604 to allow seniors involved with the group to conduct survival camps where youth are taught important life skills which will be imparted to future generations.

The third grant goes to ElderDog Canada in the amount of \$23,900, money which will allow seniors involved with the organization to engage other volunteer senior team leaders to pilot and then develop a best practice model of a peer assistance, senior-led social canine visiting program.

"Through initiatives such as the New Horizons for Seniors Program, the Government of Canada is helping to ensure that seniors maintain a high quality of life and continue as active, participating members of their communities," Mr. Keddy said. "I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate and thank the Royal Canadian Legion Branch #24, ElderDog Canada and the Mi'kmaq Burial Ground Research and Restoration Association for all their hard work in contributing to the wellness of seniors in this area."

Branch #24 president Wayne Hunt said the installation of the new kitchen equipment has been completed and has already reaped dividends for the auxiliary.

"We were able to resume our vital fundraising breakfasts after a two year hiatus. In fact, last month we raised \$650," he said.

MBGRRRA chairperson Delina Petit Pas said her group's funding will be used over the next 10 months to operate four survival camps throughout Lunenburg County, engaging elders and youth in an interactive multicultural survival skills learning experience.

"We thank the Government of Canada for granting MBGRRRA these funds so that we can complete this project," she said.

ElderDog founder and chairperson Ardra Cole said that, for many seniors, their strongest and most dependable relationship is with their dogs.

"ElderDog Canada assists seniors who need help caring for their dogs at home so that they can stay together as long as possible and continue to enjoy the many benefits of this important relationship.

"New Horizons funding will ... help us reach out to both seniors who need help and seniors who can provide help," Ms Cole said.

Since 2006, the New Horizons for Seniors program has funded more than 13,000 projects for seniors in hundreds of communities across the country. Through the program, the federal government encourages seniors to share their knowledge, skills and experiences to the benefit of others.

South Shore top doc takes new job

BRIDGEWATER — The South Shore's top doc is the McNeil government's new deputy minister overseeing the departments of seniors and health and wellness.

The province announced the appointment of current South Shore Health chief executive, Dr. Peter Vaughan, on April 16. The appointment is effective April 28.

Passionate about health care quality, affordability and patient safety, Dr. Vaughan suggested it was a responsibility offered to him about a week ago that he couldn't refuse.

"To have a role in ensuring the health system in Nova Scotia evolves to meet the needs of our future generation, it was something I couldn't turn down," he said in a phone interview.

Dr. Vaughan, 61, of Hammonds Plains, joined South Shore Health eight years ago and became chief executive in 2012.

"It's been a great learning opportunity," he said of his time with the local district health authority. "I've certainly had the privilege to work with some great colleagues across the province and I know we have great people working in the system in many, many areas."

"I think there's a recognition and a willingness to change. I'm feeling very privileged to be asked to contribute to the leadership at this time."

With his new deputy ministerial duties, Dr. Vaughan's expected to watch over the planned amalgamation of district health authorities. The reduction to two authorities is expected by 2015-16. The two authorities will be a board for the IWK, and a provincial board, with four regional management zones.

Dr. Vaughan said any perception of uncertainty surrounding the future of the South Shore Health chief executive post wasn't a factor in his accepting the job with the McNeil administration.

Prospects both nationally and internationally have come his way in the past, he indicated.

"Not to blow my own horn ... I have turned down opportunities to take on this fabulous assignment and I'm extremely pleased to be asked to be part of this transition and I think we have a huge opportunity to create the future."

Radio silence deafens accountability in 'scannerland'

The public safety airwaves became quieter this month as Lunenburg County RCMP joined other Mountie jurisdictions in the province by cloaking their police radio traffic with an encrypted system.

A public report suggests the move is part of a wide-spread change impacting RCMP forces across Canada over the course of several years.

An RCMP spokesman explained the move ensures sensitive radio conversations will stay with those authorized to hear them. They further defend the move by suggesting it reduces the ability of evil-doers who may have publicly-available radio receivers, or scanners, to commit a crime if tipped off to police whereabouts by loose-lipped law enforcement.

What the RCMP are doing is part of an unsettling trend from public safety officials who are leaning toward the technology of secure radio traffic, essentially silencing voices commonly heard by scanner enthusiasts, nosy news crews and the curious general public who have an interest in the operations of both professional and volunteer agencies funded by the taxpayer.

Digital technology offers the communications user a crisp, static-free sound over the radio and, in cases, the ability to send data in addition to voice. There's no denying the superior sound.

There's no issue with encrypted transmissions in cases of, for example, police plainclothes duties, undercover or anti-drug operations when the life-or-death immediacy of voice communications is necessary.

RCMP argue officer safety is a huge factor in the changeover. Other than the sensitivity of things mentioned in the previous paragraph, we would suggest the safety argument is baloney. We've heard the day-to-day chatter. We've heard officers ask each other where they're going to meet for lunch. We've heard when they're choosing to close a road. We've heard them complain about traffic. We've heard them ask each other whether or not they received a particular e-mail or text, or if they're able to take a cellphone call.

There's no necessity for scrambling the RCMP's general day-to-day radio operations. Considering today's smartphone technology, including the ease of texting, the RCMP, and others utilizing unscannable digital machinery, can effortlessly choose to keep

hush-hush material off the air.

If officers, knowing their conversations can be monitored, choose to broadcast the location where they're setting up a checkpoint, whose fault is that?

Speaking about un-encrypted chatter, the RCMP have said publicly there's concerns "for protecting details about ongoing investigations or operations that may be discussed via radio." Why would they even dream about broadcasting this material in the first place?

By protecting their speech, the RCMP are also casting away an advantage at their finger tips — the convenience of engaging the public's immediate help.

Gone is the ability to respond to a "be on the look out" broadcast. RCMP searching for a vehicle or person matching a particular description are out of luck getting any assistance from "scannerland."

RCMP unsure of the best spot to access a public trail to get to an emergency cannot get the help of "scannerland." RCMP unfamiliar with names of certain roads or addresses relayed to them by dispatch will no longer have "scannerland" help.

Beyond that, the RCMP, and other public entities entering unscannable digital technology, are dispatching a discouraging message to the taxpayer: "You have no business listening to what we are up to." On the contrary, we paid for it. We should have the right to some access.

Nova Scotia's rolling out changes to the long-standing Trunked Mobile Radio (TMR) system, which is, again, a taxpayer-funded venture. It's commonly referred to in radio service circles as TMR2.

When TMR2 is fully operational, which is expected to happen later this year, what radio traffic will or won't be scannable remains an unanswered question.

One can only hope that there's enough non-sensitive public safety information from the fire departments to the province's ambulance service that remains fair game in "scannerland" so we have a fair grasp of what our emergency services have on the go.

Unfortunately, with encryption, the RCMP have the option to tell the public what they think we need to know, not what we should have the right to hear on our own.

Prime Minister Stephen Harper's Bill of Rights for victims of crime is a joke and another waste of taxpayers' money.



Not too late to be heard on Fair Elections Act

Pierre Poilievre, Minister of Democratic Reform, and a cadre of federal Conservatives have insisted that Canadians support Bill C-23, the so-called Fair Elections Act. Ignoring the many experts who have pointed to serious flaws in the bill and despite the fact that the government has not produced one expert witness to support it, Mr. Poilievre has still insisted his bill is "terrific."

That was not the opinion of 160 people who passed through the Lunenburg Farmers Market on April 17. In the space of four hours, these Canadians lent passionate support to a petition calling on the federal government to withdraw Bill C-23 and begin a process of democratic consultation on electoral reform. People almost unanimously expressed outrage at both the contents of the bill and the manner in which it is being foisted on the country.

When asked whether they had voiced their opposition to Prime Minister Stephen Harper, Mr. Poilievre or MP Gerald Keddy, most said, "Why bother? You only get back a form letter." The government has been very successful in wearing us down and making us feel that there's no point in trying to be heard. When we give up and grumble only to ourselves, we allow the government to say Canadians don't care or, even worse, that we actually approve of this assault on our democracy. It's not too late to make your concerns known, but time is definitely running out.

The next federal election will not be a fair one if Bill C-23 is allowed to pass. Tell Mr. Harper that you want this bill to be withdrawn and democratic consultation to begin.

School board considers new learning spaces

Commons offer different approach for students

COUNTY — As new technologies emerge, the South Shore Regional School Board is considering new ways it can meet the needs of students.

The board is discussing the implementation of collaborative learning spaces in South Shore schools, typically known as a learning commons.

"The libraries today create an interactive and engaging experience," said Jeff DeWolfe, director of programs and student services.

Mr. DeWolfe and director of human resources, Tina Munro, presented the learning commons idea to the governing board at a meeting on April 16.

"In more jurisdictions there has been a decline in student use and there's often been a decline in the resources allocated for libraries," said Mr. DeWolfe.

The traditional sense of a library is changing, he explained, and a learning commons offers a space with both print and digital resources.

"You will see technology to broaden the learning in a meaningful way. You will see, hopefully, a connection to the resources in the library and the support that's offered there to the curriculum and the outcomes," he said.

The learning commons would also include someone to lead the virtual digital library and cataloging of print resources, explained Ms Munro.

Students would learn how to properly search on-line resources and would have 24-7 access to a school-based digital library.

"How to do proper research and validate your resources and find out how valid your information is," said Ms Munro.

A learning commons is a space that's "both physical and virtual," explained Mr. DeWolfe.

The idea is similar to what's already been implemented at the new South Queens Junior High School.

"It's a design like no other design in the province of Nova Scotia," said Mr. DeWolfe.

He says a learning commons usually has comfortable furniture to help create a collaborative learning environment.

It would also be an area for teachers, community groups and students to interact.

Based on the board's support for the project, feedback and ideas from school administrators will also be collected to develop strategic goals for elementary to high school levels.

"This process is consultative, involving staff and parents, helping us to create a multi-year vision," said Ms Munro in an e-mail.

"Meanwhile, in the upcoming year, we will examine each school's physical, virtual and human resources to determine their strengths and needs. Small gains can also be made in virtual access, physical space and collection maintenance."

Once long-term plans for the learning commons are established, a formal budget will be put together.

"We're really trying to foster this deeper level thinker, we're trying to foster the creative thinking, problem solving and those are the skills that you get through an inquiry approach," said Mr. DeWolfe.

Council okays next step in community garden process

LUNENBURG — Lunenburg council has given the green light to a motion that will likely lead to the town's first community garden.

Back in late March, Michelle Engel and Andrew Maize appeared before council to pitch the idea of creating such an entity on a 50 by 50 foot space located on the grounds of Lunenburg Academy.

They told council at the time that they hoped the garden would not only serve as a venue for growing produce, but also as a hub where people would have an opportunity to connect with each other.

The co-organizers said the plan was to rent plots for a fee of \$40 per season on a rotational basis and they asked the town for a five-year lease on the land, as well as a commitment to work together to access a water source for the garden.

Council approved the idea in principle, pending any issues which might arise from a staff review of the proposal.

At its April 8 meeting, council voted to move ahead with drafting an agreement based on the City of Peterborough's policy and related documents, with a flexible renewable term and provision of water.

That will be carried out in consultation with representatives of the Lunenburg Community Network, which is the legal and administrative home for the project.

Community helps struggling veteran

CHESTER — It's a new beginning for Shawn Wilson.

It wasn't long ago that the veteran and his 22-year-old son were living in a run-down trailer.

The rotting window frames were boarded up with wood and covered with plastic. He used a small car heater to keep his bathroom warm, many of his belongings were covered in mold and mildew, and there was no natural light.

In parts of the trailer, the "floor had given away from the wall and you could stick your hand out and wave at people if you wanted, because it was just falling apart," he says.

"Being on disability, I [couldn't] afford to pay for anything more, I couldn't afford to move, I couldn't afford to really do a hell of a lot of repairs," he says.

Mr. Wilson, originally from the Chester area, joined the Canadian Armed Forces in 1986 and served for six years. He transferred from the army to the air force and moved on to work in computer programming. Mr. Wilson is part of Mensa Canada, the International High-IQ Society, scoring in the top two per cent on intelligence tests.

He eventually worked as landscaper and, during that time, sustained a serious injury on the job.

A tree fell on him and broke his neck. For about three and a half months after that, he had to wear a brace from his torso up to his head, with pins latched tightly to his skull.

"It was horrible wearing it around, that's why I kept it. They usually throw these things away and I said 'nope,' I want to keep it just to remind myself how lucky I was," he says.

Mr. Wilson was struggling to make ends meet and, because of his condition and lack of income, he was depressed and didn't know where to turn for help.

"I had no enjoyment in life whatsoever. It was just day-to-day-to-day, I wake up, exist, go back to sleep again. It's horrible. But that's the way it was. That was my lot in life and that's what I had accepted.

"Eating Mr. Noodles and hot dogs to survive — it's no way of life."

But Mr. Wilson's life changed after a visit from an old friend.

Robert Mota of New Brunswick, who served in the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry (PPCLI) with Mr. Wilson, stopped by to visit in January.

"When you're in the military, you get a bond ... as close, if not closer than brothers. I'd have his back and he'd have mine no matter what the situation," says

Mr. Wilson. "I think he was absolutely shocked at the situation I was living in.

"I think he was super uncomfortable with staying there and he decided to drive home."

Immediately after seeing the conditions of Mr. Wilson's home, Mr. Mota posted on the PPCLI Facebook page indicating that his friend needed help.

Major Gary Collins of the Joint Task Force in Halifax saw the post. He didn't know Mr. Wilson or Mr. Mota. Donations were being made by supporters, but Major Collins decided more needed to be done and he contacted the Royal Canadian Legion Branch #44 Chester. He also came to visit Mr. Wilson himself.

"When he opened the door, he just grabbed a hold of my arm," says Major Collins, who explained to Mr. Wilson that he was going to get help.

Within a week, Mr. Wilson would leave the trailer behind.

"They came over and had arranged a place, a low income place, where at least my disability would go a lot further and I'd have a hell of a lot better place to live. I felt worse for my son really. It broke my heart having him there and having to put him through that," says Mr. Wilson.

Agnes Conrad is a service officer with Chester Legion and says, with the help of Nova Scotia Housing, the organization was able to find a better home and furniture, as well as new clothes for Mr. Wilson since the old ones were moldy.

Because of the conditions of the trailer, he had to leave a lot of items behind.

"He didn't know where to turn. He didn't know he could get help," says Ms Conrad. "If you'd seen him the day we met him, you'd think he was a different person [now]."

"It makes me feel so much better that I have my son in place and I know he's so happy that he's in a place that's so much better and nice," says Mr. Wilson.

A presentation was recently held at the Chester Legion telling Mr. Wilson's story. He also gave his friend Robert Mota a plaque, recognizing and thanking him for his support and initially getting the word out about his situation.

"I'm constantly trying to think of ways that I can repay people or do my part to help somebody else as I've been helped," says Mr. Wilson.

He's grateful for the support he has received and encourages those in a similar situation to reach out.

"Don't feel pride. Don't feel like to you have to do it yourself," he says.

"There's people out there who will help, who will be able to get you into a better state of life that's worth living."

The Ark helps people achieve fulfilling lives

Sheltered workshop celebrates 50 years

When Richard Tanner first walked in the doors of The Ark 12 years ago, he could barely speak a word to any of his peers. Life's circumstances had led him on a path of self-destruction that amounted to little more than working and boozing day in and day out.

Mr. Tanner has mental health challenges that were exacerbated by constant drinking. When alcohol became his first priority, he lost his steady job and soon found himself on the brink of collapse.

Mr. Tanner admits he started drinking when he was a child, but his problems began as soon as he was born.

"I was born premature and I had all kinds of health problems that wasn't being dealt with. ... I just couldn't do much. I wasn't taking care of myself. I didn't want to and I didn't know how to," he recalls.

His first saving grace was the South Shore Work Activity Program (SSWAP) just outside Chester. At that program, he learned better ways of coping, as well as important life skills that helped him stop drinking and finally get on the right path.

To maintain his new found sobriety, Mr. Tanner left his hometown and moved to Bridgewater to leave behind the people and places that triggered his drinking.

"I didn't want to go back to that lifestyle," says Mr. Tanner, who is proud to say he's been sober for nearly 14 years.

In addition to finding a new life in Bridgewater, Mr. Tanner also found The Ark — Lunenburg County Association for the Specially Challenged. It is here that he was able to get the continued support he needed and further develop his interpersonal skills.

"I'm very shy and I can't read, write or spell very good. I answer the phones, so I learned to get over my shyness and read and write to take messages," says Mr. Tanner. He also works in The Ark's retail section where he attends to customers to continue to improve his interpersonal skills.

"That's really helped with my shyness and insecurities and anxieties," says Mr. Tanner. In fact, just recently he gave a speech at a local school about his addictions.

"Before, I would never stand up and say nothing. I would just sit in the corner," he says. With the help and support of The Ark staff and volunteers, Mr. Tanner has accomplished and explored many things that he would not have otherwise known.

It's people just like Mr. Tanner who inspired Ora Wentzell to create The Ark. The mother of a son with complex disabilities, she led a group of concerned citizens who wanted to provide opportunities for similar children to learn and be accepted in society.

They began meeting in 1964. In 1966, the group bought an old Lower Branch schoolhouse and started The Flowers of Hope, a school for mentally challenged people of all ages. In 1970, that morphed into a sheltered workshop. The name changed to The Ark in 1973, inspired by workshops in Quebec, known as L'Arche.

In 1981, an annex opened in Bridgewater to allow participants to take a more visible and active role in the business community. The Lower Branch facility closed in 1992 when the two locations merged in the Bridgewater Industrial Park.

A year later, the Lower Branch building was sold and the money was used to start a building fund for the purchase of a permanent facility. That came to fruition in 1999 when the building at 655 King Street was purchased. Full-time operations began in May 2000.

True to its history, The Ark continues to be a community organization that provides services, such as employment and vocational training, for 60 adults with special challenges. Each client at The Ark works at a job intended to help them reach their full potential.

"We try to help people become full citizens and be a part of the community," says Ark manager David Jodrie, noting programs take into consideration the whole person. To take this holistic approach, The Ark offers educational programs, including health skills, and creates and fosters social interaction through music and dances.

Although The Ark is funded by the Department of Community Services, that doesn't cover all that The Ark offers. Additional funding is needed to maintain a balanced budget each year.

To accomplish that, The Ark offers various services and has several contracts. Two contracts come from Michelin to manufacture items needed in their Bridgewater tire plant. The Town of Bridgewater awards its gardening contract to The Ark to plant and maintain its flowers boxes. The Ark also provides shredding services to many businesses and organizations in the area.

In its woodworking shop, The Ark makes survey

stakes, builds custom furniture and offers furniture repair services. The custom furniture is available for sale in their retail section. Also adorning the shelves there is an assortment of client-made folk art, felting, and braided and hooked rugs.

"That helps us break-even," says Mr. Jodrie.

But the contracts and the sale of goods and services isn't just about the money it brings.

"We use the work as a training tool to teach these guys how to do work and be in a work environment. ... That's the vehicle that we use to, hopefully, help them get enough confidence to go out on their own and get jobs. In the end, that's the ultimate goal," he notes.

Mr. Jodrie said The Ark also works with area employers to find work placements for clients. Some of those placements have turned into full-time jobs in the community resulting in complete independence.

Other clients choose to stay rather than move on because they develop such a connection with their peers and enjoy the work and social life that they've found.

The Ark attempts to meet each client's individual desires. Whether it's to find a job in the community or develop social skills, staff continually assess and reassess clients' goals and objectives while continuing to keep up their contract and work obligations.

Anyone who has ever walked through the doors at The Ark is instantly met with an uplifting atmosphere of those who have faced adversity but triumphed in the end.

Linda Dagley shares that story and knows all too well about adversity and the havoc that extreme life stress can wreak on a person's mental health. Ms Dagley, a hairdresser by trade, found herself under so much personal pressure that she was unable to function. She was eventually diagnosed with schizophrenia and a depressive disorder, but continued to struggle for years to maintain society's idea of a normal life.

Initially, Ms Dagley refused to attend any of The Ark's programs, feeling it would stigmatize her. But not being able to secure any job after graduating from the SSWAP program, she eventually caved and, in 2001, she walked through The Ark's doors. It was a decision she has never regretted.

Today Ms Dagley works five days a week at braiding, coiling, working in the canteen and retail sections, and answering the phones.

"I love working here," she says. "It's just wonderful. ... This is my home. I live into my apartment. ... But The Ark is my home."

She and Mr. Tanner are living testaments that, with guidance and support through programs such as The Ark, everyone can reach their full potential and, as a result, live a happy and fulfilling life.

Peer mediation program up and running at Bluenose Academy

LUNENBURG — Being able to communicate is an important skill for everyone, especially students attending elementary school.

That's why staff at Bluenose Academy recently hosted a Peer Mediation Camp Day for Grade 6, 7 and 8 students to teach them how to be active listeners, understand perspectives and come up with win-win solutions to resolving problems.

The event, which attracted a dozen students, was held under the direction of guidance counsellor Bernadine Elliott and resource counsellor Francine Smith.

"Peer mediation is when older students help some of the younger students solve their problems," explains Maddie Beck, a Grade 7 student and one of the participants in the program. "Maybe a friend spread a rumour or a friend lost something of theirs and it just upset them."

Ms Elliott says the program the school is employing was developed by Peaceful Schools International and has been in use in many schools for a number of years.

"Research has shown it to be a very successful way for students to resolve minor disputes and conflicts with other students when they are at school," she says.

Peer mediator Grace Martin says the process involves two student mediators who take turns talking to the individuals involved in a dispute.

"We go back and forth and try to figure out why they're having this conflict and how we should solve it," she explains. "We want them to solve it so we just try to help them along the way."

Now that the mediators have completed their training session, the next step is putting the actual program into effect and that is expected to happen this week.

"So this year they received their special training and what we're going to do now is have regular peer mediation meetings to give them more training and to actually discuss the program and how it's being implemented in school," Ms Elliott says.

Ms Smith says it has been a pleasure to work with "such a very committed and thoughtful group of individuals who are dedicated to making their school community a better place."

Another look at the levy?

Idea of room surcharge floated again in Lunenburg

LUNENBURG — It's been nearly a decade since the idea of establishing a room levy on accommodations in the Town of Lunenburg was first broached, but such a proposal may soon be back on the table.

Lunenburg Board of Trade [LBOT] president Mike Smith brought the matter to light at a recent council meeting while updating councillors on the board's marketing initiatives.

The issue of a \$3 per night room levy was first raised by the board in 2005 and was met with stiff opposition from a handful of inn and bed and breakfast owners.

Several packed public meetings were held, and a mediator was brought in to moderate discussions on the proposal, which at times became heated.

The board of the day ultimately bowed to that pressure and dropped the idea; however, in the ensuing years, the subject has been brought up several times without any action being taken.

"It's coming up all the time and I think something's going to have to

happen very shortly," Mr. Smith told council. "What we're talking about here is marketing, marketing, marketing, and, of course, what would look after that but a marketing levy."

He said he has seen the models of what a room levy might bring in revenues to the board, and they suggest that it could deliver \$70,000 to \$80,000 per year.

"Whether they're realistic or not, I'm not sure," he added.

Mr. Smith said that, with such revenues, the board could finance its marketing strategy, allowing it to use the town's annual contribution to the board to look after capital projects and infrastructure upgrades at the board's campground.

"We have a leaking roof now and a shower facility that needs replacement or refurbishing," he said, adding that Bridgewater is currently considering instituting a room levy, as well.

"So it's not just here, it's happening everywhere," he said. "The best case scenario would be two years before it ever came here and you need a great model, a great plan, on how the funds would be spent."

Chester council awards tender for new landfill cell

CHESTER — Council has accepted a tender from Brycon Construction Limited for \$2,182,700 for the construction of a new landfill cell at the Kaizer Meadow solid waste disposal site.

In his report to council, director of solid waste Bruce Forest said Cell 2B is nearing the end of its design life with its expectancy of completion occurring at the end of June of this year.

"Following completion of this cell, operations staff are going to add another five-metre lift to the top of Cells 1, 2A and 2B which will allow for approximately eight months of addi-

tional waste placement.

"Following placement of that additional lift, it will then be required to place waste into a new landfill cell, Cell 3A," he reported.

Tenders for Cell 3A were issued on February 15, 2014, and closed on March 7, 2014.

Mr. Forest said that process produced eight tenders — which were reviewed for conformity to specification, completeness and mathematical accuracy — and of those the three, lowest bids were determined.

"The lowest bidder, Brycon Construction, has worked with us before on Cell 2B and, following up with the references provided, all provided positive reviews regarding the quality of work," he said. "Brycon Construction is more than capable of completing the work required on this project."

Council had budgeted \$2.5 million, net of HST, for the project, meaning the tender's expected cost breakdown comes in approximately \$125,000 under budget.

Mr. Forest said acceptance of the tender now will allow for work to take place on the new cell during more favourable summer weather.

A lot of living

Chester resident still sprightly at 102

CHESTER — At 102 years of age, Ruby North has done a lot of living.

Now a resident of Shoreham Village in Chester, she can tell you about her early life in England, the Great

Depression, World War II and moving to Nova Scotia with her husband and children.

And while she may not have all the physical capabilities she had decades ago, her lively spirit is still clearly evident.

Mrs. North was born in Buckinghamshire, in south-east England, in 1911. She recalls her mother teaching her to dance and play piano.

Dancing and singing continued to be among her passions throughout her life.

"I used to do the Charleston," she says, explaining that her husband didn't care for dancing so she'd dance with other people because she enjoyed it so much.

Life wasn't always easy in England. Mrs. North remembers her mother telling her that sugar was a valuable thing.

"To this day, I'm very careful with sugar," she says.

She also recalls the hardships of living through the depression, of trying to find enough food to provide for a family. Yet she managed. She knew a woman who "had a lot of money" who used to help her out by taking her meager ration coupons in exchange for better clothes for her daughter, Wendy.

"That puzzled people," she says. "They never knew we exchanged."

Mrs. North always looked out for her children, keeping them close when many families were separated during World War II. Children were sometimes removed for their own safety, but families could end up divided when the children didn't want to return to their parents being more familiar with their newer surroundings.

"So I never let mine go. We went underground," she says, explaining the family sometimes had to hide for days under the floor during air raids.

"People would never believe what it was like to go through that war."

The Norths and their three children eventually immigrated to Nova Scotia and took over an inn in Yarmouth. Daughter Wendy was 19, Tony was 17 and Christopher was 13 at the time.

The family also lived in Dartmouth for awhile. Mrs. North has now resided in Chester for many years, in the seniors apartments and now in Shoreham Village.

She walks from her room to the dining area for her meals each day and still enjoys singing. She would like to knit if her hands didn't ache.

"I was a great one for knitting," she says. "I liked to knit."

Asked to share the secret of her longevity, Mrs. North says she ate what she thought was good and did her best.

"The only thing they can do is try as best they can," she says. "Just do what you feel you can do."

Municipality asks to join alcohol project

Research indicates that the most effective method to reduce alcohol-related harm is to focus on policy that will impact the overall population rather than individuals.

The municipal alcohol project committee includes representatives from the Town of Bridgewater, the Bridgewater Police Service, South Shore Health, South Shore Regional School Board, Bridgewater fire department, Nova Scotia Community College and Emergency Health Services.

Meetings will be held the second Wednesday of each month at 10:30 a.m. in the Bridgewater Police community room.

Seniors' driving seminar presented

LUNENBURG — On April 17, the Lunenburg County RCMP in conjunction with VON, South Shore Safe Communities and the Town of Lunenburg, conducted a seniors' safe driving seminar at the Lunenburg fire hall.

The event gave senior drivers an opportunity to enhance their driving skills and get answers to any driving related questions they may have.

Leading the gathering was veteran driving instructor Fred Hebb, who is himself a senior.

"Fred has been a driving instructor for many, many years," said Beth George, seniors safety coordinator for the Bridgewater Police Service. "The program he is teaching is called 55 Alive, so it's a ... program that is a classroom-based, safe driving instruction course."

Ms George said the day's activities covered everything from how to merge properly on a highway to what each highway sign means to explanations of features on newer vehicles which might be unfamiliar to older drivers.

"Many of the participants have never taken a driving program at all or any kind of driving instruction," she said. "They might have gotten their licenses 50 years ago, so the program is intended to try to improve their skills."

Also included in the course is a section called driving decisions which is about encouraging people to modify their driving.

"Seniors may not need to get off the road, but if they can't see well at night, for example, then this promotes making the decision to modify your driving so you don't drive at times when you may not be able to hear or see or react on the road," Ms George said.

Army cadet treks in Exercise SubZero

Three days of outdoor activities in Labrador winter

COUNTY — After this winter, most people might dream of jetting off to somewhere warm and sunny, but one New Germany teen had an entirely different destination in mind and it paid off in a way that he never expected.

Seventeen-year-old Tristan Butts is a member of the 2688 Bridgewater Kinsmen Army cadets, who just returned from spending a week in Happy Valley-Goose Bay taking part in the annual cadet regional winter expedition, affectionately known as Exercise SubZero.

He was one of just 18 senior cadets from the four Atlantic Provinces chosen to attend the grueling event, which included a three-day, 40-kilometre snowshoe trek pulling all necessary equipment on sleds.

“It wasn’t easy pulling all of our gear with us, cooking in the snow and sleeping out in tents, but it was something I felt that I worked hard to prepare for,” he says.

Tristan, who is the regimental sergeant major of his cadet corps — the top appointment an army cadet can achieve — worked hard to qualify for the expedition. The cadets are selected based on their physical fitness, leadership abilities and their participation in other aspects of the cadet expedition program. Tristan previously completed an 18-day, point-to-point trek across New Brunswick by foot, mountain bike and canoe as part of cadet summer training.

“I love the outdoors,” says Tristan. “This expedition was so much fun, I wish I could have gone back and done it all over again. Sure, it was cold, but it re-

ally is a mental game to push through the challenges and get the job done.”

Exercise SubZero was about much more than just snowshoeing. The cadets learned how to pack a sled, basic cold weather First Aid and winter survival techniques. They also got a chance to practice their navigation since they were required to use map and compass skills to plot their route and follow compass bearings along the way.

The regional winter expedition is just one part of the overall army cadet expedition program. First and second-year cadets experience one day treks in their local areas, third and fourth year cadets spend two days learning different modes of travel such as canoeing and mountain biking, and cadets who successfully complete those expeditions can qualify for more.

In addition to SubZero, there is also a week-long summer expedition that involves kayaking the Eastern Shore of Nova Scotia. From there, cadets who excel move on to national and even international expeditions. Previous expeditions have included Alaska, Argentina and Tibet.

Tristan is hoping to be chosen to attend the international expedition this coming fall, which happens to be in Peru. He has a great chance of getting his wish since he was chosen as the top candidate on SubZero for 2014.

“I’m so excited, as I really did try to give it my all and motivate my team. I’ve gotten so much from the cadet program and I can’t wait to see what happens next.”

Second Story Women's Centre in Lunenburg is hosting "Good Vibrations," a weekly drumming group for women of all ages.

Facilitated by longtime circle drummer Peg Widdes, the 10-week initiative, which is funded through the Nova Scotia Department of Seniors Positive Aging Fund, will take place Thursday evenings from 7 to 8:30 p.m. beginning April 24.

"It's for inter-generational

women. It's aimed at seniors, but we want them to be able to socialize with women of all ages," Ms Widdes explains. "The reasons we are offering this are social, for starters, as well as increased mobility, maintaining cognitive functions and reducing anxiety and stress."

No music skills are needed and no time commitment is required. There is no limit on the number of participants.

Second Story's support coordinator, Sally Hutchinson, says the centre was very fortunate to be able to engage Ms Widdes to lead the circle.

"We're really happy to have been able to hire her for this program through this provincial grant," she says.

Author's first novel shortlisted for Atlantic Book Award

Lunenburg writer Rosalie Osmond has been shortlisted for a 2014 Atlantic Book Award for her first novel, "Waldenstein."

Published by Seraphim Editions, "Waldenstein" is shortlisted in the Jim Connors Dartmouth Book Award for fiction category with "Blood on a Saint" by Anne Emery and "Fallsy Downsies" by Stephanie Domet.

The Dartmouth Book Awards were established in 1989 by then mayor of Dartmouth, Dr. John Savage.

The annual award for fiction and non-fiction, valued at \$1,500 each, honour the best books published the previous year in cel-

bration of Nova Scotia and its people.

The 2014 awards will be presented at a gala on May 21 in Charlottetown.

"Waldenstein" explores the effects that a growing doubt of one's assumptions about the world have on a rural Nova Scotian community in the early 20th century. Although Ms Osmond has written several academic publications, this is her first novel.

"I am very pleased," said Ms Osmond about the nomination. "I always wanted to write fiction, but it's actually surprisingly difficult to get published."

Initially, she secured an agent to get her book published, but they eventually parted ways. However, Ms Os-

mond didn't give up on getting her novel in the hands of readers. She found Seraphim Editions through an internet search. The publisher didn't require a hard copy so she sent her work via an e-mail attachment.

"The first Canadian publisher I sent it to took it," said Ms Osmond.

The author's next reading will take place on May 14 at 2 p.m. at the Thomas H. Raddall Library in Liverpool. All three authors in the Dartmouth category for the book awards will participate in a reading and discussion at the Alderney Gate Public Library in Dartmouth on May 15 from 7 to 8:30 p.m.

Fiddleheads — The taste of spring

A fiddlehead is the tightly coiled crozier of the ostrich fern that grows along river and stream banks in the Maritimes.

It's one of the first — and best — fresh tastes of spring. Not only are they a tasty regional delight, but also richly nutritious, so make the most of them.

Only harvest your own if you are confident that you can identify the correct ferns, as some fern species can be toxic. Keep in mind that it is more difficult to tell species apart at the fiddlehead stage than later in their life-cycle.

If you do harvest, follow the rule of 3/7. Each root produces seven frond ferns. Pick no more than three, leaving four to grow. This method allows plants to flourish year after year, and guarantees fiddlehead gathering for years to come.

Whether you pick your own or purchase fiddleheads, choose those that are deep green in colour with smallish, tightly coiled heads. If possible, remove brown scales the day they're picked.

To prepare fiddleheads for cooking, rinse lightly under running water and pick off any brown leafy bits by hand. Trim off the browned end of the stem along with any tough material. Make sure to always cook fiddleheads thoroughly — they are mildly toxic when raw.

To freeze fiddleheads, first clean and trim them, then add them to boiling water for one minute. Remove them from the water and plunge them into a bowl of ice cold water to stop them from cooking further. Remove them from the water, dry and transfer to freezer bags. Remove as much air as possible from the bags — I like to suck out air with a straw.

To use any time of year, simply thaw then prepare as you would fresh fiddleheads.

Simple Boiled Fiddleheads

Ingredients:

- 2 cups fresh fiddleheads, cleaned and trimmed

Directions:

Pour an inch of water into the bottom of a saucepan and bring to a boil over medium-high heat. If you have a steamer basket, set it in the pan and put the fiddleheads in the basket; if not, set the fiddleheads directly in the water. Cover, reduce heat to medium and steam or simmer for 10 to 14 minutes or until you can easily pierce them with a fork.

Either use boiled fiddleheads for another recipe or enjoy dressed with butter, salt, pepper and a dash of vinegar or lemon juice.

Fiddleheads with Bacon

Ingredients:

- 2 cups boiled fiddleheads (see above)
- 2 slices bacon, cooked and crumbled
- 2 cloves garlic, minced or pressed
- 1 teaspoon red pepper flakes
- Pepper to taste

Directions:

Combine boiled fiddleheads, crumbled bacon and minced or pressed garlic in a sauté pan over medium heat and cook for 2 to 3 minutes, stirring.

Remove from heat, add red pepper flakes and pepper, and serve.

Fiddlehead Salad

Ingredients:

- 2 cups fiddleheads, cleaned, boiled, and cooled
- ½ cup roasted red pepper pieces
- 1/2 cup roasted mushrooms in bite-sized pieces
- ¼ cup grated parmesan cheese
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- ¼ cup extra virgin olive oil
- ½ teaspoon black pepper

Directions:

Combine all ingredients in a large salad bowl and toss together.



South Shore Chorale presents spring concerts

In keeping with the season, South Shore Chorale has put a fresh twist on things with this year's spring concerts, both in tone and presentation.

From the Appalachian dulcimer to the Irish whistle and old-time mountain gospel, the four-part community choir will perform a novel selection of music with guest performers Pennybrook, an acoustic duo from Lunenburg County that specializes in original instrumental compositions with Celtic flavour.

The chorale will perform three concerts the first weekend in May as it builds on its efforts to spread the joy of music to communities on the South Shore.

Under the direction of conductor John Scott, university and chapel organist at Acadia University, and with the accompaniment of Manhattan School of Music graduate pianist Sharon Gow-Knickle, the choir will sing a varied program, from American folk songs to a "Choral Reflection on Amazing Grace," written for Westminster Chapel Choir and dedicated to the children of the victims of 9/11.

Here and There a Traveller will also include a choral rendition of Robert Frost's poem "A Road Not Taken," a stark contrast to early American shape-note hymns and songs that are

also on the program.

Shape notes are markedly different from traditional church choir and congregational singing. The style was invented in America in 1798 to help singers sight read and quickly learn unfamiliar music, and it became popular in American singing schools in the 1700s and 1800s.

The duo Pennybrook is comprised of Charlie Wilson, who plays Irish flute and whistles, and Jude Pelley, who plays guitars, mandolin, and the Appalachian dulcimer, a string instrument that originated in the southern Appalachian region of the United States. It sounds much like a

cross between a harp and a banjo.

The duo's music is rich and complex, drawing on both traditional and contemporary influences. The pair has given concerts from Nova Scotia to British Columbia and has released its first full-length CD of original music.

Here and There a Traveller will be performed May 3 at St. John's Anglican Church hall, Lunenburg, at 2 p.m. and at 7:30 p.m. at Wesley United Church in Petite Riviere.

The third concert will be May 4 at 3 p.m. at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Bridgewater with the a reception to follow.

So young and so far away from home

The world 150 years ago was a very different place. Today we couldn't imagine shipping boat loads of children to a new world without specific safeguards to protect them, monitor them and reunite them with family as quickly as possible. For several decades though, separating children from their families and sending them far away was not only common practice, but, in many associations and societies, it was acceptable and encouraged.

The more than 100,000 children and young women who arrived in Canada in the 1800s and early 1900s may have come under difficult circumstances, but many endured to leave a lasting legacy for their descendants. Researching these individuals, who had little say in where they were sent and what their roles in society would be, used to be difficult. Increased interest in the young immigrants in the past dozen years, however, has brought their history to the forefront. Countless databases, records, websites and organizations have sprung up to answer the call for information, making it easier for researchers to locate their ancestors and to learn their incredible stories.

Marj's Place (<http://jubilation.uwaterloo.ca/~marj>) is a website that provides extensive information and resources to help researchers find the young immigrants they seek. Simply follow the Child Migrants - Home Children link to find Young Immigrants to Canada. The site was created and is maintained by Marjorie P. Kohli of Waterloo, Ontario.

Kohli doesn't focus on one particular organization, such as Barnardo's British Home Children or Roman Catholic children. Her research encompasses all children and young women who were brought to Canada between 1833 and 1939. One of the links she provides is for the Library and Archives of Canada (LAC). This particular link is broken and leads to an HTTP Error 404 page. To find relevant information on

the LAC, use the error page and click Immigration and then Home Children - Immigration Records listed beneath Databases.

The philosophy held by many of the organizations sending youth to Canada was that the children who were orphaned, abandoned or living in pauper environments would have a better chance for a healthy, moral life in rural Canada than in the urban slums of England. In many instances, the farms accepting these children viewed them only as cheap labour and domestic help.

There is no doubt many of the children thrived in their new homes and were treated with respect and as members of their "host" family. Many other children though suffered in harsh conditions and were either physically or sexually abused or both.

The links on Kohli's site provide visitors with dozens of avenues to locate an ancestor and to learn more about how they lived when they arrived in Canada and the reasons behind why they were sent here. Several of the links lead to databases for home children. Information such as names, ages, dates, ships they arrived aboard and placement details - including family names - are included.

Amongst the numerous links are those for specific groups for women (such as Filles du Roi - The King's Daughters), Children from Countries other than Great Britain and Children Sent to Places other than Canada (such as Bermuda and Australia). Various other links that may hold vital information included First World War records, Societies and Organizations and books on the topic. There's also a section for queries about the children.

Roots to the Past

Migrants arriving and leaving

Many migrants are arriving and some are getting ready to leave, with reports coming in fast and furious. Two mallards started to come to the feeders of Sue Beaver at Garden Lots. This is the first time she has had mallards come to her backyard. Judith Orr reported that she had a pair of mallards and a pair of Canada geese hanging around in Union Square. She noted more red-winged blackbirds there this year and I've noticed more at locations that I visited than had been around last year. Hopefully, these birds will stay on territory. Judith also noted a pair of barred owls calling at night behind her house. A pair of noisy killdeer have arrived there. Judith also saw her first tree swallows and, by April 11, four were present. On April 13, I noted tree swallows at three locations. It was great to hear one of them sitting on a wire and chattering. At Kingsburg, a red crossbill was a surprise visitor to the feeders of David Walmark.

In Rhodes Corner, two northern flickers and a male pileated woodpecker are tending as reported by Mandy Eisenhauer. Mandy and her husband, Russell, took a drive between First South and Indian Path and spotted three red-winged blackbirds, two common mergansers, a common loon and a small flock of Canada geese. A great find by Charlene MacDonald in First South was a snowy egret. In the same area of the egret, but further along at Mason's Beach, I spotted a pied-billed grebe. Looking towards Lunenburg from Corkum's Island, I was interested to see 122 long-tailed ducks. Only small groups existed over the winter, so such a large concentration means that this species is getting ready to move out in mass for migration.

Dorothy Poole and Kevin Lantz accompanied me on the first of my three owl monitoring routes that I run. This route covers Lapland-Laconia and back through Camperdown to Conquerall Bank. We ran the route on April 11 and were pleased to locate nine barred owls and three northern saw-whet owls. In addition, we heard one American woodcock and one ruffed grouse. Other night

sounds included wood frogs and spring peepers.

Cathy Etter saw a pileated woodpecker pair industriously carving a big hole way up on a telephone pole at the corner of Pinehurst Avenue and Miller Drive in Bridgewater. I made note that, at 4 a.m. one day recently, the song sparrows were very vocal on territory in Bridgewater. Brian Kenefick saw two ospreys back on the nest in Lilydale. Northern cardinals are strongly singing at many locations. From Milton, Dorothy Poole reported that a brown-headed cowbird dropped by for a short visit. Lisa Bell spotted two American woodcocks so far on Bush Island.

Snowy egrets showed up at the Saltmarsh Trail, Rainbow Haven and at Lawrencetown on the Eastern Shore. A little blue heron was located by Jeannie Shermer-

horn at l'Ardoise in Richmond County. Sharon and Ronnie D'Entremont took a drive around the Clyde River loop and found seven palm warblers. They also had two hermit thrushes, tree swallows and lots of common grackles. I noticed that, by April 13, common grackles had returned and were everywhere. Johnny Nickerson saw two American oystercatchers that had returned at Cape Sable Island. He also reported two snowy owls at Daniels Head, as well as two greater yellowlegs. Alix D'Entremont had some good finds, including 30 tree swallows at Goose Creek Marsh in Yarmouth County. At Pinkney's Point, he sighted two black-bellied plovers, 13 dunlin and four killdeer. He also saw a northern mockingbird at North East Point in Shelburne County and 43 brant in Pubnico. Laura and Hans Toom had a blue-headed vireo singing at Duncans Cove and they also had a brown thrasher. It was reported that snowy owls were still at Bacarro and two at the Lawrencetown Beach. Sue Abbott gave an update for returned piping plovers. This species has been seen at Johnsons Pond, Sand Hills, Crows Neck Beach, Fox Bar, Cherry Hill and Lawrencetown.

Boston Marathon 'thrill of a lifetime' for first-timer

BRIDGEWATER — Alfred Lacey was at work last year when he heard about the bombings at the Boston Marathon.

"It was kind of traumatic in a way because I had a lot of friends that were there," he said in an interview April 16.

Mr. Lacey recalls trying to call people he knew who were there, but cell service was jammed up throughout the city.

"We were trying to get in touch with them to make sure everybody was okay, which in fact they were," he said. "A friend of ours finished roughly the same time that happened and he's pretty devastated from that actually."

Mr. Lacey, 54, of Hebb's Cross laced up the runners for the first time at the Boston Marathon on Monday, which has been a life goal for him since he was a kid.

"I always watched it on TV when I was growing up and always thought I would love to do it. Once you realize what the process is, you second guess it, but then you think it's not so bad after all."

Mr. Lacey qualified to run in Boston at a marathon in Fredericton last year. Seven months later, he ran another marathon in Moncton and qualified to run again in Boston in 2015.

His training regimen started 18 weeks prior and consisted of running upwards of 90 kilometres a week before tapering off near the end.

"It's been a hard, old winter running outside," he said.

Mr. Lacey travelled with Victor Nickerson from Liverpool, whom he trained with all winter and who has run the Boston Marathon eight or nine times, he said.

"He's a pretty avid runner and he's done well pretty much every time. It's one of those things where you run together, feed off each other and, if it works out well, it works out well."

The experience of the Boston Marathon alone is what he hoped to gain from it.

"It's a thrill of a lifetime. You're running there and there's like a million people, people cheering you on, people trying to high-five you."

Even though Mr. Lacey went for the experience, he still hoped to do well.

"My last two marathons I've shaved five minutes off each one. It'd be kind of nice to shave that off, if not more," he said.

He wasn't worried about the security situation.

"Hopefully, it'll all be safe for everybody and the experience will be a positive one and not a negative one. That's all you can hope for."

Mr. Lacey hoped to take in Red Sox or Bruins game over the weekend before the race, depending on whether or not they could get tickets, noting that he's an avid fan of sports teams from Boston.

"I bleed Boston."



A collaborative approach to finances

Swain and Associates' team approach keeps clients in the loop

The collaborative and comfortable space at Swain and Associates Chartered Accountants makes talking about your finances more inviting.

"It's not always a comfortable thing for people to talk about their taxes. It's something that's very complex," says company president John Swain.

Taking the edge off is an important part of the company's vision. Instead of at a desk, clients can expect to have a conversation in a living room type setting, on comfortable couches and chairs.

"We deliberately want folks to feel like they're on an even keel with us and that we are part of their team, not necessarily telling them what to do — more of, let's talk about this, let's collaborate, let's see where some opportunities or where some issues might be," says Mr. Swain.

The growing accounting firm is made up of eight employees and has recently moved to a new location on Aberdeen Road in Bridgewater. For the last four years, the group has offered services including corporate and individual tax returns and consulting for business start-ups, purchases or sales.

But before Mr. Swain purchased the firm that later became Swain and Associates, he worked out of his sunroom at home for about three years. He started the business as John Swain Chartered Accountant back in early 2008, specializing in small business and personal tax returns.

"I kind of envisioned being that accountant that works at his home for the rest of his career and be happy to do it and happy to wear all the hats," he says.

What he originally had in mind changed after he was asked if he'd be interested in buying an accounting firm in 2011.

He went from being a sole practitioner, who was considering hiring an assistant, to having a full-blown staff and client base. Since then, the business has grown much bigger and faster than he expected.

"But we've managed the growth very effectively because we never want our clients to feel like they're just another number," he says.

The ability to relate to clients has been a key factor in

the company's success.

Both Mr. Swain and company vice president, Mark Feindel, began working as sole practitioners and know what it's like to start from scratch.

"We know what it means to be an entrepreneur. We know what it means to not know ... is the phone going to ring and can I go get groceries next month because I have to feed my family," he says.

"As entrepreneurs, that's who we want to attract as clients because we are in the same boat as them. I'm not sure that everybody could say to their client, 'I know exactly where you're at, I was there three years ago.'"

That in itself, he says, brings clients a lot of comfort.

The company's team approach to finances aims to keep clients in the loop as much as possible.

"Our client is the expert in their business. We are the experts in the tax department and the management consulting side of things. They are going to know their business more than we are. It would be ludicrous to act like we know what's best.

"We really don't want our clients to ever be surprised if possible, even with our fees If there's some extra work that we think might take a little bit more, we want to address that with the client right away," says Mr. Swain.

"Usually we get further using that approach."

And that's one way they aim to earn the client's trust.

While the team at Swain and Associates take their work seriously, they try not to take themselves too seriously. Hence the tribute to The Beatles album "Abbey Road" on the sign in front of the building.

"We plan to do an iconic album every year to keep the town engaged. Maybe next year we'll do a Bruce Springsteen cover," says Mr. Swain, who is also the lead vocalist in a local band called "Sound Castle." His colleague, Mr. Feindel, is the drummer for a band called "Know Issue."

"We truly want to look different, act different than any other CA firm, really, in Canada. We've thought very long and hard about that and finally

it's starting to take shape.

"We want people to feel like, 'oh, okay, this isn't going to be the same old proverbial root canal,'" he laughs.

The team even turns tax season into a fun competition.

"We're kind of having an informal the guys against the girls. Of course, there's only two of us, so the girls are always kicking our butts," he says.

In the future, the company aims to expand its collaborative approach to accounting in other parts of Nova Scotia.

"We want to get it right in Bridgewater and, when we're comfortable, we want to get it to the point where we can set this up and replicate it in the same way that it is here, both the look and the attitude," he says.

They hope to break in to the Halifax market sooner than later, and eventually expand to Cape Breton and Yarmouth.

And at the same time maintain the company's vision.

"We want to project that we love our jobs, we are treating it very seriously, but also we want you to feel comfortable. We do not want you to ever feel intimidated."



Navy veteran trio accepts commemorative watches

BRIDGEWATER — A trio of navy veterans who served during World War II savoured the acceptance of specially marked wrist watches commemorating service time spent on the water.

The April 17 presentation, during a meeting of the Admiral Desmond Piers Naval Association, was unexpected recognition, said Frank Hammond, 91.

Mr. Hammond, who served with a volunteer reserve special combined operations unit, was in a landing craft that set down on Juno Beach on June 6, 1944. Mr. Hammond plans to proudly wear his new watch to France this June during ceremonies acknowledging the the 70th anniversary of D-day.

He said he was happy to be in Lunenburg, while a refit was taking place, when the war ended.

Maxwell Croft, 90, spent 30 years with the merchant navy, starting his time on the water at age 16. He said he'll always wear the timepiece.

"I'm lost for words," he said when asked what the watch meant to him. "It means a lot to me. I'm very pleased to accept this watch."

Elmer Mason, 87, served in the merchant navy for 12 years and was a deck officer when he retired.

"It's a good memory of times past," he said of the watch, noting it was great to be a part of the presentation with his fellow shipmates.

The watches are part of a Time is Ticking project, designed to see Second World War veterans receive special timepieces that also honour the 100 anniversary of the Canadian Navy.




